Tippecanoe Battlefield Interpretative Center & History Store

> The Museum and adjacent memorial commemorates and interprets the nationally significant November 7, 1811 Battle of Tippecanoe. The Museum focuses on the Battle, early settlement and nineteenth century Native American life styles. The History Store features a large assortment of books on America, Indiana, military and Native history and culture and offers reproduction historic goods, collectables and period clothing.

Fort Ouiatenon Blockhouse

3921 South River Road

4 miles southwest of West Lafayette

Fort Ouiatenon was Indiana's first permanent Euro-

pean settlement, with a replica of an eighteenth century fur trading post. The Blockhouse is open May-August weekends only. This is also the site of the annual Feast of the Hunters' Moon a



historical reenactment featuring traditional crafts, goods, food and life-styles of the 18th century trade period.

The Center houses our library, collections, archives, and museum store. It is the number one destination for all researchers tracing their family heritage or exploring other areas of local history.

The Photo Archives contain thousands of photographs and negatives of buildings and scenes documenting Tippecanoe County's history. The photo archives also contain a portrait collection of persons in the county.

Additionally, the TCHA Archive collection contains over 250 business, organizational, and personal collections of materials. Archive access is by appointment only.

The Alameda McCollough Genealogy Research Library is open Thursdays and Fridays 1 to 5pm and the first and third Saturdays of the month 10am to 2pm. The Library (only) is closed January and Holidays.
